Overall, fibroids and menstrual disorders were the most frequent indications for hysterectomy. Women who underwent vaginal hysterectomy were older and more likely to have a surgical indication of prolapse compared with those who underwent an alternate mode of hysterectomy.

Updated Hysterectomy Surveillance and Factors Associated ...

The most common indication for hysterectomy was a menstrual disorder (40%), followed by fibroids (26%) and pain (11%).
