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Chainmail Rules For Medieval Miniatures

The line led off with a further expansion of the LGTSA Medieval Miniatures rules: a rulebook called "Chainmail" (1971). One of those expansions was a 14-page "fantasy supplement", which would prove pivotal to the future D&D game. That fantasy supplement may also explain why Gygax's first collaborator, Jeff Perren, didn't continue on.

By that time Chainmail had been superseded, the 'boxed set' was available and "Men & Magic", "Monsters and Treasure" and "Underworld and Wilderness" were there to help. Chainmail preceded D&D, described as 'rules for medieval miniatures', but the guts of D&D were ripped from this book and my band of nascent role-players had copies.

The LGTSA Medieval Miniatures Rules were developed primarily for use with Elastolin and Starlux figures, which are 40mm scale. However, they may be used equally well with any scale--including the inexpensive Airfix "Robin Hood" and "Sheriff of Nottingham" 25mm plastic figures. Although the rules have been

Among the three was a pamphlet of medieval rules entitled Chainmail which adapted much of the medieval rules published in the Domesday Book. Late in the development process - Gygax would later call it "an afterthought" - Gygax added to the end of Chainmail fourteen pages of a "Fantasy Supplement" which detailed the behavior of Heroes, Wizards, dragons, elves and various other fantastic creatures and people.

Chainmail is a medieval miniature wargame created by Gary Gygax and Jeff Perren. Gygax developed the core medieval system of the game by expanding on rules authored by his fellow Lake Geneva Tactical Studies Association member Perren, a hobby-shop owner with whom he had become friendly. Guidon Games released the first edition of Chainmail in 1971 as its first miniature wargame and one of its three debut products.
