FINITE CLAUSE; A finite clause includes a primary verb — a verb that can be inflected for tense, person and sometimes number — and includes a subject. A finite clause can stand alone as an independent clause (a sentence), or it can serve as a coordinate clause, a subordinate clause, or a supplementary clause. So.. clause – (1) a finite clause—one or more noun phrases together with a predicator (a verb) that combine to express a complete thought (a stand-alone sentence); (2) a nonfinite clause—a verb or a verb with complements that express limited meaning (not a stand-alone sentence).
