Martin Heidegger is the best known of Husserl's students, the one whom Husserl chose as his

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successor at Freiburg. Heidegger's magnum opus *Being and Time* was dedicated to Husserl. They shared their thoughts and worked alongside each other for over a decade at the University of Freiburg, Heidegger being Husserl's assistant during 1920–1923.

Heidegger began his career in theology, but then moved into academia as a student of philosophy. While Heidegger's philosophical inquiry began in alignment with Husserl's work, he later challenged several key aspects of Husserl's transcendental phenomenology. A foundational break from his predecessor was the focus of phenomenological inquiry.

Martin Heidegger werd op 26 september 1889 geboren in Meßkirch (Oberschwaben) in een rooms-katholiek gezin, als oudste kind van Friedrich en Johanna Heidegger. Phenomenology of Perception stands in the great phenomenological tradition of Husserl, Heidegger, and Sartre. Yet Merleau-Ponty's contribution is decisive, as he brings this tradition and other philosophical predecessors, particularly Descartes and Kant, to confront a neglected dimension of our experience: the lived body and the phenomenal world.

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
