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### Key Skills Communication Adult Literacy

In Wales Key Skills have been replaced with Essential Skills Wales (ESW) (as of September 2010.) Essential Skills Wales is the suite of skills qualifications which replaced the previous Key Skills of Communication, Application of Number and ICT, and the Basic Skills of Adult Literacy, Adult Numeracy and Skills for Life ICT.

### The Role of the Physiotherapist in Learning Disabilities ...

Physicians must encourage open communication with patients. All patients—not just those with limited health literacy—can benefit from clear communication practices. When conveying information verbally, physicians and staff should communicate in key points, avoiding excessive information; most patients will not remember more than three messages.
