The modern study of three-valued propositional logic began in the work of Jan Lukasiewicz in 1917, and other forms of non-classical propositional logic soon followed suit. 1. Paraconsistency. A logic is paraconsistent iff its logical consequence relation \Vdash , either semantic or proof theoretic) is not explosive.
