Most moral dilemmas in medicine are analysed using the four principles with some consideration of consequentialism but these frameworks have limitations. The Case for Disclosure. The doctor-patient relationship, unlike an arms-length transaction, is a fiduciary relationship. A fiduciary is “one who owes to another the duties of good faith, trust, confidence and candour”. 7 As a fiduciary relationship, it must rely on principles of autonomy, non-maleficence, beneficence, justice and fidelity at all times. 8
