Although agencies are not required to prepare a Biological Assessment for non-construction activities, if a listed species or critical habitat is likely to be affected, the agency must provide the Service with an evaluation on the likely effects of the action.

The bio-psycho-social model assumes that mental health problems are hardly ever limited to just one domain of human experience (say, just a "mental" problem).
