The main difference between morphology and syntax is that morphology studies how words are formed whereas syntax studies how sentences are formed.

The word "sentence" is from the Latin for "to feel." The adjective form of the word is "sentential." The sentence is traditionally (and inadequately) defined as a word or group of words that expresses a complete idea and that includes a subject and a verb.

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Sentence Definition and Examples in English Grammar

These are called ergative verbs.. There are other kinds of verb patterns. For example: link verbs have the structure Noun + Verb + Adjective (She looks happy) or Noun + Verb + Noun (He became a teacher).; some two-part verbs can have the structure Noun + Verb + Particle + Noun (She gave back the money) or Noun + Verb + Noun + Particle (She gave the money back).

Adjective After Verb. An adjective can come after some verbs, such as: be, become, feel, get, look, seem, smell, sound. Even when an adjective comes after the verb and not before a noun, it always refers to and qualifies the subject of the clause, not the verb.. Look at the examples below: subject verb adjective Ram is English.; Because she had to wait, she became impatient.
