Neurofibrillary tangles are insoluble twisted fibers found inside the brain's cells. These tangles consist primarily of a protein called tau , which forms part of a structure called a microtubule. The microtubule helps transport nutrients and other important substances from one part of the nerve cell to another.

In Alzheimer's disease, tau proteins change shape and organize themselves into structures called neurofibrillary tangles. The tangles disrupt the transport system and are toxic to cells.

### Causes of Alzheimer's: Is It Hereditary?

The fluorodeoxyglucose (FDG) PET can show where the brain has low metabolism that may match some forms of dementia. Amyloid PET scans look for the deposits of amyloid plaques that are typical of Alzheimer's disease. Tau PET scans are mostly used in research. These look for the tau protein tangles seen in Alzheimer's disease.
